






# Monday, October 17



## Mount Tabor – Shrine of Transfiguration, Cana and Nazareth





In the morning, we ascend Mount Tabor (by taxi) to visit the Shrine of the Transfiguration, the site of the revelation of the glory of Jesus Christ as the Son of God, overlooking the plain of Jezreel, where the battle of Armageddon will be fought as foretold in the Book of Revelation.



Later, we visit **Cana**, the site of Jesus' first miracle at the wedding where he turned water into wine.



In the afternoon, we return to **Nazareth**, home of the Holy Family, to visit the Church of the Annunciation and Mary's Well where the angel Gabriel announced the Incarnation to the Virgin Mary.



Tuesday, October 18


**Sea of Galilee, Magdala, Jesus Boat  
and Mount of Beatitudes**




The Sea of Galilee is rich in memories of the 3 years of Jesus' ministry around its shores. Among Holy Land sites, the Sea of Galilee has changed comparatively little since Jesus walked on its shores and recruited four fishermen as his first disciples.





Today we visit Magdala, the birthplace of Mary Magdalene.

# Wednesday, October 19


## Cruise to Capernaum and Tabgha



Today we continue our tour of sites on the Sea of Galilee where Jesus carried out his work of evangelism by calling the first disciples and healing the sick. Crossing the lake by boat, we visit Capernaum which became Jesus' home town and the scene of many of his miracles.



Here we will visit the house of Peter and the synagogue where Jesus promised the Eucharist in his “I am the bread of life” discourse: “Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you cannot have eternal life within you.” (John 6:22-59).



Synagogue Where Jesus Preached



Capernaum in Galilee - Luke 4:31-43


This is 2 overlapped photos, for example, these are the same basalt grinding stones

Later we travel to Tabgha and the Church of the Multiplication, the site where Jesus performed the miracle of the "Feeding of the 5,000" in which Christ multiplied five pieces of barley bread and two small fish that a boy offered from his lunch into enough food to feed a massive crowd of people.



# Thursday, October 20

## Qumran, Jericho, Mount of Temptation and Jesus' Baptism



After breakfast, we check out of our hotel and drive through the Jordan River Valley to reach Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were written more than 2,000 years ago.



We also stop at the ancient city of Jericho, famed as the oldest city in the world, where Jesus healed Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, and dined with Zacchaeus, the rich tax collector who climbed the Sycamore tree to get a better view of Jesus when he arrived.



We also visit the Mount of Temptation where Christ was tempted by the devil during his 40-day fast.



We then travel east along the Jordan River Valley to Bethany Beyond the Jordan where Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist and where you will have the chance to renew your baptismal promise. This is also where Elijah and Elisha crossed the Jordan, and where the children of Israel, led by Joshua, entered the Promised Land.


# Staying 5-nights Thursday-Tuesday, October 20-25



Friday, October 21  
**Mount of Olives and Mount Zion**



In the morning, we visit the Mount of Olives which Jesus visited many times and from which Jesus ascended into heaven. We will also visit Pater Noster Church, built over the caves where Jesus taught his disciples how to pray The Lord's Prayer.





After visiting the holy shrines on the Mount, we will walk the "Palm Sunday Road" visiting the Church of Dominus Flevit, built where Jesus wept for the city's future destruction and the dispersion of the Jews from their homeland.



We will also visit the Garden of Gethsemane and present site of the Church of All Nations where Christ prayed on the night of his betrayal. Our tour continues visiting the Tomb of the Virgin Mary and the Cenacle, the Upper Room in which the Last Supper was held.




We also visit the church of St. Peter in Gallicantu built on the site of the palace of the high priest, Caiaphas, where Jesus was held after his arrest and where Peter denied Jesus three times “before the cock crows”.



Saturday, October 22

# Jerusalem Old City, Via Dolorosa and Garden Tomb



Today we follow in the footsteps of Christ in the old city of Jerusalem along the Via Dolorosa (“Way of Sorrows” in Latin), the path where Jesus was led in agony, carrying the crucifixion cross from the Church of the Flagellation to Calvary. We will follow the Stations of the Cross, including: where Jesus was condemned to death, where he receives His cross, where Jesus falls the first time under His cross, where Jesus meets Mary his mother, where Simon helps Jesus to carry His cross, where Veronica wipes the face of Jesus, where Jesus falls the second time, where Jesus speaks to the women of Jerusalem, where Jesus falls the third time, where Jesus is stripped of His garments, where Jesus is nailed to the cross and where He dies on the cross, is taken down from the cross and is laid in the tomb.



Along the way, we will visit the Church of St. Anne and the Pools of Bethesda as well as the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, where Jesus was Resurrected and rose from the dead.



In the afternoon, we stop at the Kotel (the Western Wall of the Temple also known as the “Wailing Wall”), passing through the Jewish Quarter. We will also visit the Garden Tomb which lies outside Jerusalem's Old City walls and is considered to be Christ's burial tomb.




# Sunday, October 23


## Bethlehem, Yad Vashem and Ein Karem



In the morning we visit Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus where we will explore the Church of the Nativity/Church of St. Catherine where Jesus was born. We will also visit St. Jerome's Cave beneath the Church of the Nativity where St. Jerome spent 30 years beginning in AD 386 translating the Scriptures from Hebrew and Greek into Latin to create the first official vernacular version, and the most enduring version of the Bible.



Later, we visit the Shepherd's Field where the Gospel of Luke tells us an angel announced the birth of Jesus, then to the Garden of the Righteous (Yad Vashem), Israel's official memorial to the 6 million Jewish victims of the Nazi Holocaust.



We then continue to Ein Karem, the birthplace of John the Baptist where we will also see the Church of the Visitation where the Virgin Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth telling her that she was to become the mother of Jesus and pronouncing her canticle of praise, the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55).



Monday, October 24  
**Masada, King Herod's Palace  
and the Dead Sea**



After breakfast, we drive to Masada fortress where we board a cable car to the top to enjoy a guided tour through the ruins of King Herod's palace. We will imagine life here thousands of years ago where Herod the Great built his winter escape and haven from enemies, complete with castle, storerooms, cisterns and a foreboding wall high above the Dead Sea on this tall, rocky mesa.



Later we make our way to the Dead Sea, the lowest elevation on earth at 1,300 feet below sea level and so loaded with minerals that no fish can live in it. Here we will have a chance to float in the waters or bathe in the muds. The Dead Sea is so dense that bathers can lie back on its surface and read a newspaper. The Dead Sea's therapeutic qualities attracted Herod the Great and its minerals and sticky black mud provided balms for Egyptian mummies and cosmetics for Cleopatra.







CFAR is only available if **purchased at the time of original plan purchase and within 14 days of the date your initial deposit** for your trip, and provided you have paid for the full cost for all non-refundable trip costs for your trip prior to your cancellation of your trip. The cost of the Plan including Cancel For Any Reason coverage is
